

# Worship Team Roles and Responsibilities

This is an active team-orientated position which leads the congregation in song during the Church's Worship Service. Some musical experience required, can be obtained with practice with a worship team. Instrumentalists require fundamental skills and experience playing with a group is greatly beneficial.

## Time Commitment: 2-4 hours per scheduled service

- Depends on the scheduling / Availability of others  
For example: Serving two Sundays a month w/ Practice is at least 5 hours
- Depends on Specific Team's Preparation, Service, and Practice

### Worship Leader

The Worship Leader prepares the set list and chord charts for the team. The Worship Leader works with the rest of the worship team to choose, arrange, and play the music to support the congregation's worship in song. The Worship Leader communicates with the Worship Team, AV Team, and Pastoral Staff. They will ensure that the songs are aligned with the sermon topic along with ensuring that songs are lyrically biblical and musically appropriate for the congregation to sing.

### Singers

Singers lead the congregation in song through their example in worshiping God through Song. Singing does not necessarily require prior experience but will be required to learn while practicing with the team to ensure the correct pitch and clarity. Singers will prepare and practice the songs to be familiar with the songs melody, lyrics, and sometimes harmony.

### Instrumentalists

(Piano, Keyboard, Guitar, Bass Guitar, Drums)

Instrumentalists are required to have learned the fundamentals of their instrument before playing during Sunday Service. Instrumentalists work together to play the instrumental of the song alongside other worship team members contributing their personal style and skills to the group. Instrumentalists play music to support the Worship Leader, singers, and congregation without distraction, worshiping and glorifying God through their craft.
